Tennessee Exhibitors must have a (90 day) and Out of State Exhibitors must have a (30 day) Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and meet the requirements of the Scrapie Program and the Jefferson County Fair.

- 5. Exhibitors are allowed to enter NO more than two (2) animals per lot.
- 6. Exhibitors must comply with Tennessee Department of Agriculture Rules and the Jefferson County Fair General Rules.
- 7. If only one entry in a class, exhibitor will receive 2nd place premium money.
- 8. Ribbons will be given for places 1st thru 5th.
- 9. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champions will receive Rosettes.
- 10. Breed Show will be provided for any breed with ten (10) or more head and three (3) exhibitors. Breeds with less than ten (10) head and three (3) exhibitors will show in All Other Breeds, Class one (1).
- 11. Last day to enter sheep will be Thursday August 10th.
- 12. Entry fee: \$1.00/head.
- 13. Exhibitors will be admitted to the grounds free (carnival ride tickets will be available for purchase). Only vehicle and trailer with animals will be admitted free and MUST park in designated area.
- 14. Feed and bedding must be furnished by the exhibitor and animals kept in assigned pens.
- 15. All animals must arrive at the fairgrounds by 5 P.M., Wednesday, August

- 16, 2017 and will be released at the conclusion of the show.
- 16. Decisions of the Show manager and Judges will be final.
- 17. Supreme Ram and Ewe will be selected from the Breed Show at the conclusion of the show.
